## QUESTIONS ABOUT YOU, YOUR HOUSEHOLD, AND YOUR USE OF THE FACILITIES

Only one response per household. The response should come from an adult who can speak for the entire household.

## QUESTIONS ABOUT THE AQUATIC CENTER RENOVATION OPTIONS *(renters skip to Question 6)*

The pool is failing now and the membership will eventually have to replace (Options A, B, C, or D) or close (Option X) the pool. The table (at right) briefly describes each renovation option, its total cost, and the cost per household based on a one-time assessment. (Note: the \_\_\_\_\_ is looking into several payment options, such as paying the assessment in installments over a six-month period or bank financing. To simplify the comparisons, the table shows only the one-time payment.)

5. If the membership does not choose the replacement option, repairs will become so costly that the pool will have to close (Option X). These options affect all members, whether or not they use the pool because the Aquatic Center contributes to the value of property in \_\_\_\_\_ (see \_\_\_\_\_). In general, Options A and X = decrease property value, Option B = maintain property values, and Options C and D = increase property values.

Given the potential effects on property values, your household's use of the Aquatic Center, and the estimated one-time assessment, rank the options from 1 (1st choice) to 5 (last choice).

A	Remove or cover the pool and install a floor to allow for other uses, such as a gymnasium.	\$1.8 million	\$700	\$570	\$350
B	Replace the existing 6-lane, 50-meter pool with a new 6-lane, 50-meter pool.	\$2.8 million	\$1,090	\$880	\$540
C	Create a more modern aquatic facility by replacing the 50-meter pool with two pools – a 6-lane, 25-meter pool and a shallow-water leisure pool with a waterslide and spa.	\$3.5 million	\$1,350	\$1,090	\$670
